- Approve August minutes

- Secretary's report
 - Thank you to Camille for serving in an interim board position for the past few months!
- Treasurer's report
 - Balances from October meeting:
 - *Checking \$4,792.20*
 - *Savings \$25.00*
 - The banking password was changed by Kaia, but not communicated before she left her position. Sarah will try and correct this before the new board takes over in January.
 - Kristopher followed up post meeting with the updated password and current balances.

- MoF SHERN Cache Location update (Sarah)
 - MoF's Facilities team extended the fence line around the building, so the SHERN location had to be relocated. It is now on the west side of the building, near the dumpsters. Sarah and Nicole will update the group with a map following the meeting
 - The Supply Subcommittee will work on updated the cache inventory as some additional supplies have been added
 - Plans to identify a secondary cache location will be revisited in the new year
- Webinar reports / other learning opportunities
 - ARCS (Association of Registrars and Collections Specialists) will be offering a textile conservation workshop in April 2024. Sarah will share details once they are announced.
- Updates from members
 - Gary is traveling to Chile and Easter Island later this month
 - SAM: Asian Art Museum recently had an issue with their new HVAC system. A power outage causes leaks in the HVAC lines throughout the entire system, running through galleries. The interim director will be staying on through March 2024.
 - MoF: Do any other organizations have separate disaster response plans for their exhibits departments?
 - SAM does have a loan response plan in place for in the gallery disaster, but the work is handled by the Collections staff not the exhibitions staff
 - Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle: Archives is still in the process of identifying a new location. Current building was recently targeted by copper thieves and vandalism
 - MOHAI: Their rooftop HVAC units were hit by copper thieves this year. Called attention to the fact that there were no cameras or surveillance equipment that captured activities on the top of the building where the units are located.
